EXT. A SECLUDED PLACE TO TALK IN PLEASANT WEATHER - MID-DAY

MAN, around 30 , is waiting and trying to look casual despite his clean-cut khakis, polo shirt, and baseball cap. He acts like he looks: businesslike and a little out of place.

WOMAN, mid-40's, approaches, looking like anyone taking a nice walk in a sun dress and sunglasses.

They greet amicably.

MAN
Hello, I'm glad you came out.

WOMAN
It's certainly a lovely day, though not so lovely that a phone call wouldn't do?

MAN
That's not- you know. How are you doing?

WOMAN
Oh, trying to avoid anything like work. I'd say "some day you'll understand," but maybe not. I suppose it's more of the usual for you, hmm? You still have that dog?

MAN
Affirmative... No. Yes for the dog, no for the usual.

WOMAN
I bet. Okay, drop the window dressing - you're obviously here about work, and they know that's probably not happening. If you're as sharp as I remember then you know I'm just here to see them try.

MAN
We need assistance. Help. We need your help.

WOMAN
Right.

MAN
We know this is a tough sell-

WOMAN
Yes.

MAN
-but you're the only likely success-

WOMAN
Of course.

MAN
-for something vital.

WOMAN
(waits a beat)
That's it? That's all she gave you. What the fuck?

MAN
She-

WOMAN
(increasingly annoyed)
She sends you here for "something vital"? How much did you fuck up to get knocked down to errand boy?

MAN
She didn't send me. She's retired.

WOMAN
Bullshit, kiddo, she'd work there until-
(she stops herself)
How?

MAN
I can't-

WOMAN
Never mind. Is there trouble at home?

MAN
They- I'm not sure.

She looks out for a few moments.

WOMAN
You should get out here with your dog, maybe you'll find a date. Work to live, don't live to work, right, sailor?
(a few moments more)
Okay, as a contractor. I'll come in once or twice, otherwise they can fuck off. Where's that asshole?

MAN

WOMAN
